We are so excited for our Colour Me Happy Challenge this Friday! Thanks again to our incredible P & C volunteers who are working so hard to make this event a great success. Please also be aware that there will be a lot of fun music, happy kids and excited parents and staff making positive noise at this event, which is likely to be heard in the surrounds of the school. The events on the oval are likely to be happening from 11.30am until 2.30pm and we apologise in advance for any disruption to our neighbours for this one off event and hope to limit any disruption to these times.

Several times in the last week we have been informed by concerned members of the public about the unsafe behaviour of our students around traffic and road crossing. We have spoken at length with all students about this and have engaged in road safety lessons with every class. I have personally spoken to a number of individual students and families about the behaviours of some students also. I urge you to speak to your child about making safe decisions around roads, particularly those students who are riding bikes or scooters to school. Many students are making very poor choices about road crossings and it is questionable whether or not they have the road sense and maturity to ride independently to school.

Crossing the bridge safely has now been flagged as an issue by a community member, as well as ongoing concerns about the unsafe ways children are using the crossing at the southern end of the bridge. I appreciate your ongoing support in keeping our children safe and once again encourage you to make an informed decision about whether or not your child is capable of riding SAFELY to school.

SCHOOL SWIMMING

School Swimming is for students who have not reached a satisfactory standard of water safety and survival skills, and are unable to swim 25m confidently unaided in deep water. The Program focuses on weak swimmers in Year 2 to 6 as well as students with special needs such as new arrivals in Australia and students with disabilities.

Instruction will take place at Cobargo Pool. The Program will continue daily for two weeks from Monday, 27 November 2017 to Friday, 8 December 2017, departing school at 1pm and returning before 3:15pm. There will be no charge for instruction. The total cost for transport and pool entry for the 10 day scheme is \$90. The cost for students with a season pass to Cobargo Pool is \$60. Please return notes as soon as possible.

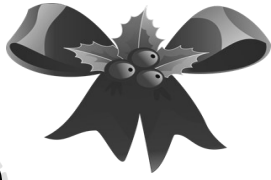

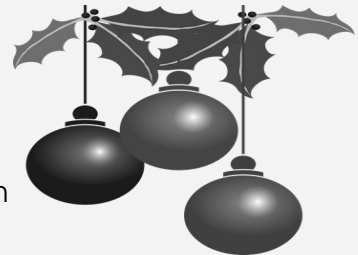
